The Youth Choirs support three choirs: Youth Choir, Preludes, and the Alumni Choir. The choirs exist to promote a lifelong enjoyment of music and singing by the education and development of musicianship in young people; to develop qualities of teamwork, self-confidence and leadership; and to aim for excellence in performance. The Youth Choir takes young people from age 9 to 18. Preludes, its training choir, takes children from 7 to 11. years. We take new members for the Youth Choir at the beginning of term, subject to audition. There is no audition for Preludes. The Youth Choirs organise at least 3 concerts each year and tour overseas regularly. The choirs also take part in many concerts for charity at the invitation of local organisations.

The Alumni Choir is an occasional choir of ex-members which meets twice a year for rehearsal and performance in our Christmas and summer concerts.

Celebrity Concerts: promote each year a season of six high quality concerts by both established and rising professional musicians. During each season a variety of instrumental and voice groupings are offered, mainly of Chamber music. 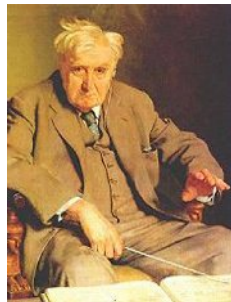

Celebrating the Feast of St Cecilia: Finzi's *For St Cecilia* was written to a commission from the St Cecilia's Day Festival Committee and first performed in 1947. Written for choir and tenor soloist to words by Edmund Blunden, the work mixes moments of ceremonial grandeur with moments of intense lyricism in a rousing celebration of the patron saint of music.



Sea Pictures, a setting by Elgar (1899) of five songs for mezzo soprano and orchestra, is a reflective and moving evocation of the sea and seafarers.

We commemorate the 50th anniversary of the death of Ralph Vaughan Williams with a performance of his choral symphony. With text from *Leaves of Grass* by the American poet Walt Whitman, and first performed in 1910, the overall impression is of a work that is panoramic in scale and as big as the sea itself. The flavour and sound of the sea is everywhere.

After graduating with a first in Classics and English from Jesus College, Oxford Catherine Milledge was awarded a distinction for her post-graduate diploma in piano accompaniment from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and went on to gain a MMus in solo performance. She has performed in the Queen Elizabeth Hall and Purcell Room, the Wigmore Hall and St. John's, Smith Square, as well as the Bridgewater Hall, Manchester and Holywell Music Room, Oxford.

It is difficult to imagine more festive music than the four anthems Handel composed for the coronation of King George II and Queen Caroline in Westminster Abbey on 11 October 1727, including the ever-popular *Zadok the Priest* which has been sung at every coronation since 1727.

Handel's *Gloria*, previously unknown for nearly 300 years, was discovered in the library of the Royal Academy of Music in London in 2001. Clearly written as a showpiece for coloratura soprano, it is an important addition to the Handel catalogue.

Two of Bach's best-known works also feature in the concert.
